Commander Rex Maddox Scholarship Awarded to Cadet Wagstaff

The Mount Vernon Chapter established the Cmdr Rex Maddox Scholarship to recognize an exceptional Junior ROTC cadet every year. To qualify, a candidate must:

- -be in the last year of an ROTC or JROTC program;

- -demonstrate a high degree of loyalty to the unit, school, and country

The scholarship is named for a past Mount Vernon Chapter president who served in the Pacific in World War II as well in the Korean and Vietnam wars. He actively supported Honor Flight and World War II memorial events and contributed generously to both the MOAA and Mount Vernon Chapter scholarship funds.

On 13 May, CDR George Wallace presented the Mount Vernon Scholarship Award to Army JROTC Cadet William Wagstaff of Alexandria City High School in Alexandria, Virginia. William is an outstanding student in all subjects and a recognized leader in his unit. He will be attending VMI and obtaining a commission through the AFROTC Program. June Observances -







From Virginia Counsel of Chapters (VCOC)

VCOC Advocacy in 2025

Virginia's team consisted of VCOC President Col Diana Kupchella, USAF (Ret), 3rd Vice President Col Monti Zimmer, USA (Ret), Ms. Michele Costello, and MOAA's General Counsel Mr. Doug Sanders. They visited the offices of all Virginia delegation to Congress and conveyed the importance of MOAA's Priorities for 2025:

- The Military Spouse Hiring Act: MOAA urges Congress to add military spouses as target group under Work Opportunity Tax Credit
- Unaccompanied Housing Improvements: MOAA urges Congress to require DoD provide transparency on barracks funding and to empower lawmakers to identify and address these challenges in their districts and states
- Improve Military Health System Access: MOAA urges Congress to pass legislation establishing an MHS digital access assistance platform
- Ending the Wait Report Priorities: MOAA urges Congress to enact legislations to bolster the legal framework for creating presumptive condition
- Caregiver Support Improvement: MOAA urges Congress to pass the Veteran Caregiver Reeducation, Reemployment, and Retirement Act

MVC Presented MOAA Medals to Local JROTC Cadets

The MOAA Junior ROTC (JROTC) awards program recognizes outstanding cadets or midshipmen in their next-to-last year in the program who has demonstrated exceptional potential for military leadership. The presentation of an MOAA ROTC/JROTC medal is an excellent way for us as a chapter to gain exposure in our community and, at the same time, foster a positive military recognition among the youth of the community. The medals are awarded by a local chapter and not the national organization. The program is entirely voluntary, and no chapter is obligated to give awards. To be eligible for an award, a candidate must:

- be in the next-to-last year of an ROTC or JROTC program
- be in good academic standing;
- be of high moral character;
- demonstrate a high degree of loyalty to the unit, school, and country; and
- demonstrate exceptional potential for military leadership.

MOAA Medals are usually presented to one junior at each awarding school who is selected by their leaders to assume a higher leadership role during their senior year.


