

pilot at Patuxent River. Since I am not an aviator, what I took away was that as he approached for landing, the aircraft suddenly turned hard, upside down, and nose dived. When he ejected from the aircraft, the ejection seat shot him into the ground. Later it was discovered that one of the



verticle stablizers had malfunctioned. Before the flight, the aircraft's electronic self check system didn't recycle through the checks completely, and it missed the malfnction. Since the aircraft was fairly new at the time, it was the first incident of this kind. As the result, although the investigator didn't find Col Yurovich neglegent, but stated "a more prudent pilot would have reacted differently". Further investigation showed that Col Yurovich was correct that the equipment indeed malfunctioned and was completely at fault for the crash. Col Yurovich said he re-told the story to young people, as an inspiration not to get discouraged by adversity. I listened in awe. Many of our members had done things during their long and dintinguished careers. (Continued on Page 5)





MVC MOAA Legislative Corner

From MOAA National HQ, summarized by Despatch Editor

What the Shutdown Means for Troops, Retirees, Veterans, and Families

Currently Serving and Families

Service members will report to duty during the shutdown but won't be paid until funding is restored. Oct. 1 paychecks, drawn from funds budgeted for last fiscal year, were processed, but Oct. 15 checks won't be without funding or other legislation.

Retirees and Survivors

- Armed services retirees, to include Coast Guard retirees, will continue to receive retiree pay during the funding lapse. Officers who retired from the U.S. Public Health Service or NOAA would not receive their next paycheck (Oct. 1 checks, covering pay from September, were processed).
- · Commissaries and exchanges will remain open.
- Elective and routine medical procedures at military facilities may be canceled or postponed; contact your provider to confirm your appointment. The shutdown will not affect retirees using TRICARE or TRICARE For Life benefits in the private sector.
- Military pharmacies will remain open, but hours may change.
- Survivor Benefit Plan payments will continue.
- Retirees and survivors covered under the Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP) won't be affected. Federal employees whose FEDVIP premiums are deducted from their federal pay will retain coverage; their premiums will be deducted from retroactive pay when posted.

Veterans/VA

The VA's contingency planning website contains full updates on the department's status during the funding lapse. Some key points:

- Health care facilities will remain open.
- Education, housing, disability, and other VA benefits will continue.
- Burials will continue at VA cemeteries, as will applications and related processing (except for preneed burial applications). Grounds maintenance and headstone placement will be delayed.
- Transition and career counseling services will stop, and regional benefits offices will close.
- The primary call center (1-800-MyVA411), crisis line (988, press 1), and VA benefit hotline (1-800-827-1000) will remain open. GI bill and cemetery-applicant assistance lines will close.

They don't always talk about it, since often in our careers we have done things very difficult to explains to civilians, and sometimes even to fellow service members. I was once again reminded that I was in the company of great people.

After the inspirational presentation from Col Yurovich, Col Jerry Krueger, MVC MOAA member and VFW Post 609 Commander, spoke to us on the current status of Alexandria's Monument to the City's War Dead. According to Col Krueger, the Monument was origianly established in 1940 to commenmorate Alexandrians perished during the Revolutionary War, War of 1812, Civil War, Spanish American War, and World War I. Until the recent years, there was no effort to update the monument to include the casualties from the subsequent conflicts. As Vietnam Veterans aged, a plaque to honor the 68 Alexandrians perished during the Vietnam War became a priority and funds were raised; it became reality on Memorial Day, May 27th, 2024, then a duplicate plaque was put up at the Gadsby's Tavern on Flag Day, June 14th, 2024. The efforts to honor Alexandrians who died in other conflicts continues. Please see the article below.







Alexandria's Monument to the City's War Dead

On March 28th, 2025, Phase 2 of the fund-raising campaign for additional veterans' name plaques honoring those Alexandrians who perished fighting World War II and the Korean War started. The goal is to install the plaque by Memorial Day, 2026, 8 months from now. Planning again is being carried out by the Alexandria City Historian's office (Gretchen Bulova et al.). The timing of next Memorial Day's plaque dedication is offered as one part of our localVeterans' program, offered during the Alexandria City's America 250 Commission's programmed events to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the founding of our country (1776). That is: "semiquincentennial"! We aim again to also present duplicate plaques at the Gadsby's Tavern wall nearest the occasion of June 14th: Flag Day 2026.


